2022 JAGM Awards Banquet/Charity Auction

March 12 was an unusually cold, windy day, but the temperature and ambiance in Lee Jacobsen's garage was comfortable and festive as JAGM members got

together for the annual presentation of awards and the return of our charity auction. Lee had the building set up perfectly for the event, with tables and chairs for the lunch and auction, a set of rolling carts to display all the donated auction items, and of course the great display of cars (40? 50?... I should have counted!).

We started out with Lee leading a quick tour around the garage, sharing stories about many of the cars he has collected over the years, primarily a mix of British cars (MG, Triumph, Lotus and Jaguar) and

Packards, which looked very large amongst the Brits.

We moved into the awards presentations, starting with the JAGM "Most Active" trophy. This was won by Bob and Pat Matejek, edging out Chuck and Louise Dia-

mond by just a few points. This trophy had been perched above our computer since March of 2020, when Ellie and I won it (JAGM didn't award the trophy last year because of all the COVID disruptions). We'll miss it!

Bob then announced two 2021 JCNA Newsletter Awards for articles in "The Indicator." First, in the category of Jaguar Heritage, the set of three Matt Nold tribute articles in the April issue took first place. The three authors were Gary Cunningham, Bob Matejek and Wayne Schultz. Congratulations to all!

The second JCNA award was in the Travel category, where Phil Crutchfield won first place for his article on the JAGM Summer Drive, which appeared in the



August issue. You can't go wrong starting with a quote from Robert Burns. Congratulations, Phil! Proof again that this club is blessed with a wealth of great writers and organizers.

Then the charity auction began, once again benefitting "Homes For Our Troops", an

organization that provides houses for disabled veterans (see the sidebar below for more). We had not held this auction since December of 2019, and the selection of donations was most impressive. It took about two hours for our volunteer auctioneer, Gary



Cunningham, to work through the great quantity of books, car models, artwork, car parts, Jaguar clothing, posters and banners, a hand-crafted Jaguar stepstool and of course the final item, a 1960's Ford Thunderbird wheel cover that has been auctioned off each year. That wheel cover is then returned for the next year's auction,



SCCA Saginaw Valley Region Ice Runs Beaverton, MI



When it comes to cars, I have to admit that Ellie is right – I'm kind of a nut. Every now and then, though, I run into people who are car-nutty enough to make me feel downright normal.



When you want to feel normal, it's good to compare yourself to people who are way out on one of the flat ends of the bell curve. This is what I did on Sunday, February 27th, when Steve Myerscough and I drove up to see the SCCA Ice Run on Ross Lake, in Beaverton, Michigan.

An ice run is very much like an autocross or slalom event; the major difference is the track surface, which is ice on a lake. Also, autocross and slalom events typically happen in comfortable temperatures. An ice run requires cold temperatures; otherwise the competitors might end up very, very wet. Considering these two factors, I think it's safe to say the 55 entries in the ice run on the 27th all reside toward the flat end of the car-nut bell curve.

JAGM's own Tom Hudak is one of the organizers of



these ice runs and has been doing this since the 1960's. Tom ran his Saab 900 in the front drive class, finishing a very nice 3rd in a field of 15 or so. He finished in the top three in his class in all four of the 2022 Ice Run

events, suggesting that over 50 years' experience is probably a more important factor than the lightning-quick reflexes of youth in ice racing!

Tom even allowed Steve and I to ride along on two of his runs, which was very entertaining. On such a glare ice surface the direction the car is pointing and the direction it's traveling are often quite different! But in the middle of a lake, there's nothing (other than a few orange cones) to hit, so the penalty for losing control is only time, not sheet metal or mechanical damage.

Back to the subject of the degrees of car-nuttiness. Tom and the other drivers in the "stock" classes are somewhat "out there" on the bell curve. But even they appear pretty normal compared to the people who build cars specifically for ice racing. These include cars with modifications to lower weight and increase power, but also with studded tires. These studded tires are not the studded tires you might remember for street use (before they were banned for de-

stroying pavement). No, these tires have studs about an inch long and were installed, one at a time, by the "way out there" car owners.

The car pictured here, originally a VW Rabbit, achieved the lowest times on this Sunday (roughly half the time posted by the best of the unmodified cars). It achieved this by a combination of extremely



low weight, enhanced power and aerodynamics, and of course the radically studded tires. Other interesting modified vehicles included a wild '81 Buick Regal and a Corvette-powered '89 Jeep Comanche pickup.

This was the last event on Ross Lake for this winter, but the Saginaw Valley Region of the SCCA will hold a new slate of Ice Runs next year. I can highly recommend it as a fun and different winter activity, even if you just want to reassure yourself (or your significant other) that you're not the nuttiest nut out there.




Wyoming, and the Black Hills and Badlands in South Dakota.
