



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From the President

The Rise and Fall of the Hillman Imp (continued from last issue)

Despite a bad start, the Hillman Imp was a fun car to drive. Soon things started to go wrong again. Next to fail were the brakes. Luckily I was not moving fast and could use the parking brake to avoid hitting anyone. **Fixed that.**

The car had a transaxle unit. That is, the transmission and differential were in one unit. The drive emerged on a short axle connected to the main axle by a thick rubber ring or a doughnut. This provided the flexibility to allow the suspension to move. This doughnut failed, throwing the axle into the rear muffler box and destroying that. Of course, I could not afford garage repair so I had to fix this by the side of the road. The new doughnut was sold with a metal band holding it under compression so it could be fitted. This band let go as I was fitting it, so I had to take the bus back to the parts store to get it replaced. *Fixed that*.

Drove it to the nearest muffler place (sounding very enthusiastic along the way) to get the muffler replaced. **Fixed that.**

Drove the car to see friends about 200 miles way. On the way the rear of the car suddenly cramped down and I could select no gears. On inspection, the transaxle case had cracked leaking all the oil and seizing the gear box. It was towed to a town parking lot and I caught the train home. I returned to the car 2 weeks later not knowing what I was going to do. As I sought sought inspiration, a young man approached who lived opposite and had noticed the car sitting there for some time. He was a bored mechanic, recovering from illness. He offered to help get the transaxle out for food and drink. He even had some contacts who obtained a used transaxle for a very reasonable price. I'm deeply indebted to him, but cannot even remember his name. Fixed that.

I drove it home without incident and all was quiet for a while. Then one day, pulling away from a stop light, I was overtaken by a wheel. It turned out to be my own back wheel that had come off, complete with the brake drum. This meant putting

my foot on the brake had little effect and even the parking brake worked on only one wheel. I did eventually mange to bring the car to a stop, as my wheel cruised on down the road. It was eventually stopped by a gentleman waiting for a bus. As a kid I had often asked people for my ball back but this was the first time asking if I could have my wheel back. It turned out the soft washer designed to keep the central hub nut on had let go or had not been installed correctly. The miracle was that the only damage to the car was the back drum plate was bent. I straightened it, put the wheel back on and continued on my way. Fixed that.

By now my faith in the car wavered badly but I decided to take it on a 200 mile journey to visit my mother. Half way there the engine stalled and could not be re-started. Towed to a nearby garage, I found the head gasket had failed, a common fault on this engine. The head was removed, but three of the studs in the block had been broken. Costs to repair this were mounting fast. I told them to stop work, put everything in boxes in the car and I had it towed home. I thought of repairing it, but by this time I was tired of throwing money at the car. I had it towed to its final resting place.

It was back on public transport for me for a while. Next time ... a Porsche.



As we departed the Filling Station and headed to




Meijer Gardens, the weather broke and gave us large patches of blue sky with puffy white clouds. A steady breeze and perfect

DIRECTIONS to Cell Block 7

Cell Block 7 is easily accessed by either US 127 or I-94. We are located at **3455 Cooper Street in Jackson (49201)**, Michigan on the grounds of the operational State Prison of Southern Michigan.

From the north or south, take US 127 to the Parnall Road exit. Head east on Parnall Road until Cooper Street (M-106). Take a left on Cooper Street and the museum entrance will be on your right.

From the east or west, take I-94 to exit I 39 for M-I 06/Cooper St. Follow Cooper Street north until you arrive at the museum on your right.

Price: Tickets are \$15...\$10 for seniors.

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
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May Speaker -- Martin Rowell

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"While I Am At It", Rod Lindoo Story continues

Ever take your Etype out for a long drive on a hot day and end up even hotter in the car? A lot of heat is given off by the 4.2 engine, it all seems to come thru the front firewall and transmission tunnel. Here is what I'm doing to hopefully cool down the inside so the air conditioner might have a chance to cool it down.

While I'm at it, I found a ceramic insulating paint that keeps the hot out, cleaned up the outside of the transmission tunnel and painted it with this Lizard Skin paint. After that I also got self stick foam insulation with a radiant metal insulator. A big upgrade!

While I'm at it, The interior also got insulated with "reflectix", yep the same stuff you get at Home Depot. Pieces were cut, fitted and contact cemented on. This baby should stay cool inside now!

While I was at it, I found one of my floor mats weighed 10 lbs and felt oily. Couldn't figure out at first why but then found the answer while ordering parts online. The hot water crossover tubes were leaking, soaking the mat. I ordered a new stainless steel set, these should last me a lifetime.

And while I'm at it, what to do with the front end? Might as well clean it up and repaint.

And while I have all the suspension apart I might as well replace all the rubber bushings, steering rack rubber mounts, sway bar rubber mounts and anything else since now is the time I can get to it easily.

I hope I can remember where all the wires and parts go back!
